Direct object pronouns

- Direct objects are people or things that receive the action of a verb.
- To avoid repetition, the **direct object pronouns** can take their place.

Subject	Direct Object	Subject	Direct Object
yo	me <i>me</i>	nosotros(as)	nos <i>us</i>
tú	te <i>you (s.)</i>	vosotros(as)	os <i>you (pl.)</i>
usted (m.)	lo <i>you (s.)</i>	ustedes (m.)	los <i>you (pl.)</i>
usted (f.)	la <i>you (s.)</i>	ustedes (f.)	las <i>you (pl.)</i>
él	lo <i>him</i>	ellos	los <i>them</i>
ella	la <i>her</i>	ellas	las <i>them</i>

Direct object pronouns

- Direct objects are people or things that receive the action of a verb.
- To avoid repetition, the **direct object pronouns** can take their place.

la stands for Paula

¿Invitaste a **Paula**?

Did you invite Paula?

Sí, **la** invité. Ella viene.

Yes, I invited her. She's coming.

Direct object pronouns

- When answering a question, remember to change the **direct object pronoun**, if necessary.

object me changes to te

¿**Me** vas a llamar?

Are you going to call me?

Sí, **te** llamo más tarde.

Yes, I'll call you later.
